Coleby and our People Neighbourhood Statistics for Coleby Parish from the 2011 Census

This document contains an analysis of Neighbourhood Statistics for Coleby Parish and highlights those areas significantly different from comparators.

Although the Census was undertaken in 2011, these Neighbourhood Statistics were generally released in 2013 and are the most up to date and accurate figures available.

Comparative information is provided for the Local Authority (North Kesteven), Region (East Midlands) and for England as a whole.

Only selected statistics relevant to Neighbourhood Planning are examined here.

In this document, comments are only made about the statistics themselves. The relevance of any statistics to the Neighbourhood Plan will be set out in the Neighbourhood Plan itself.


Age structure



Summary of the statistics

Both the mean and median ages for Coleby were significantly higher than the comparators. The median age for Coleby was 11 years older than for England as a whole.






Car / Van availability

Summary of the statistics

Vehicle availability in Coleby is extremely high. This is even more pronounced at the higher end where Coleby households with 3 cars / vans (11.2%) is double the national proportion and those with 4 or more (5.9%) is more than three times.



Country of Birth



Consistent with other statistics, the proportion of Coleby Parish residents born in England was very high.



Summary of the statistics

The proportion of detached dwellings in Coleby Parish is much higher than regionally or nationally.

Terraced dwellings are a much lower percentage.



Economic activity

Summary of the statistics

Coleby Parish's economic activity reflects the age profile, with a much higher proportion of retired people, fewer full time employees, fewer unemployed and fewer economically active students.

The most notable difference is the very high percentage of self-employed (15.7%) compared to comparator figures of around 9%.

Ethnicity



Summary of the statistics

The proportion of white British residents is very high when compared to the region and to England as a whole.

There are corresponding reductions in other ethnic groupings.



Health & unpaid care



Summary of the statistics

Coleby's residents see themselves as healthier than the norm despite the higher age profile.

The percentages assessing themselves as having daily activities limited by their health is smaller than comparators. There is a corresponding increase in those assessing their health as good.



The proportion of those providing unpaid care for others is slightly lower than comparators, with the norm being 1-19 hours of unpaid care per week.



Household composition



The proportion of households with all the family over 65 is high. This contrasts with the proportion of one-person households over 65, which is similar to other areas.

The proportion of households with no children in them is also high.



Household language



Summary of the statistics

In the 2011 census 168 of 169 households in Coleby Parish had all over 16s speaking English as a main language. This is significantly higher than other areas. There were no households where none of the adults spoke English as their main language.





The proportion of married people is significantly higher than comparator areas and the proportion of single people is significantly lower.

Other categories such as those who were separated, divorced or widowed was broadly similar to other areas.



Passport holders with non-UK passports are very low.







The proportion of residents saying they were Christians was high and the proportion of those with no religion was correspondingly low. The proportion with other religions is also low.



Summary of the statistics

The average number of persons per household (2.4) is the same as the national average and only 0.1 larger than the North Kesteven and East Midlands averages.

The proportion of homes with central heating (97.6%) is slightly lower than the NK average.

Coleby houses have a larger average number of bedrooms and total rooms.

Summary of the statistics


The proportion of homes owned outright (49.1%) is significantly higher than the District, Regional and National (30.6%) positions.

People buying their homes with a loan or mortgage are correspondingly fewer.

Social rented housing is broadly equivalent to other areas.

Privately rented housing (10.1%) is about the same as North Kesteven but significantly lower than the East Midlands and England (15.4%).

The small proportion of residents living rent-free (2.4%) is double that of other places.



Usual resident population

Summary of the statistics

Coleby Parish's population in the 2011 Census was 410.

The balance of males (48.8%) / females (51.2%) is about the same as other areas.

Population density is very low compared to other areas and is only 10% of the density for England as whole BUT the population density is, of course, much higher in the village than in the parish as a whole.
